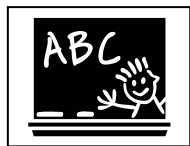

Developing skills for managing a range of emotions is therefore very important for their emotional wellbeing. Parents, carers and schools all have an important role to play in supporting children's emotional development.

Parent Consultations - Autumn 2017

Consultation evenings this term will be held on Tuesday 17th October and Thursday 19th September between 4.00 and 7.00 p.m. The purpose of these consultations is for you to discuss with your child's teacher (and teaching assistant if applicable) how well your child has settled into their new year group; as well as being an opportunity to share any information or concerns. The staff will also be able to indicate any areas of support required. We strongly advise that you meet first with your child's English and Maths teacher; then if you require an additional appointment with your child's class teacher to discuss any specific concerns, make it after your first appointment so that you already have a clear picture of learning. I know some parents have previously felt compelled to make two appointments; it is not compulsory, just offered.

In response to feedback we will not be reviewing Support Plans and EHCPs during these meeting, please look out for separate invites to review these plans with our SENCo and your child's teacher / TA.



Electronic booking for consultations can be completed following the steps below:

- 1) Log on to www.schoolinterviews.co.uk
- 2) Enter **Parent Consultations code: hb6eg**
- 3) Enter e-mail, child(ren)'s first **AND** surname.
- 4) Choose the exact date and time(s) to suit you.
- 5) Receive instant e-mail confirmation of booking.

Bookings close on Monday 9th October.

Consultations take place in classrooms. We ask all parents to meet in the hall where we will be serving complimentary tea and coffee and there will also be an opportunity for discussion with school governors. From this point we will ring a bell every 10 minutes and send parents to the appropriate room. We hope this will ensure equality for all parents in the amount of time with their child's teacher. If you would like more time, please return to the hall to make an additional appointment following your consultation, or for an informal update pop onto the playground at the end of the day to see your child's teacher.

Please note the playground is not supervised and parents are responsible for ensuring normal playground rules are adhered to such as no climbing trees or accessing out of bounds areas.
