I hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas break and were able to spend some time relaxing with family and friends. It was super to welcome the children back to school on Monday looking wide awake and refreshed - a great start! We also welcome two new members of staff: Mrs Sanders to Y6 and Miss Marston to Y4. Both have enjoyed their start here and say how helpful and friendly the children are.

We ended 2014 in a very strong position with a Good Ofsted report, excellent SATs results and top of the ten local schools in the league tables (not to mention an invitation to meet the Secretary of State for Education in London to celebrate our achievements!)

In 2015 we look forward to building on that even further, through close partnership with our Parent Forum, welcoming new members to our Governing Body, further strengthening transition with both TRIS & JTHS and more linked up working with external advisors, HMIs and local primary schools to share excellent practice.

Our internal tracking shows us that children in all year groups across school have the best standards of attainment we have ever had; this is due to consistently effective teaching, specifically targeted at children's level of need. We have undeniable evidence that the implementation of the three-way class split for Literacy and Numeracy has had a positive impact on progress at all levels and we will be looking to continue to build on this.

Our Monitoring and CPD (Continuing Professional Development) programmes are stronger than ever, as we look to focus on the areas for development identified through our own evaluations as well as those from external advisors and Ofsted. We are in no way complacent about the position we have achieved. If anything we are more determined than ever to continue our journey upwards to ensure every pupil gets the best education and experience throughout their time at Thomas Russell Junior.

The value of developing Literacy and Numeracy skills is undeniable, but this year staff already have some really interesting and exciting ideas about how we can improve the broader curriculum to fully engage children and offer even more opportunities to fire their imaginations. We want to maintain the excellent musical provision, through delivery by specialist teachers and access to experiences such as choir singing at the LG arena. Our PE provision is exceptional with qualified coaches, our own swimming pool and the broadest range of extra-curricular clubs you will find in a very wide circle of school, so we look forward to this reaping further rewards in competitions and events. Further to this we are looking at greater team learning across school (building on the effectiveness of our mixed age Golden Time and work in Houses for our Christmas Concert) with ideas for science week, maths challenge day and of course our selection of residential visits and trips which the children love and are fundamental in making life long memories.

We look forward to you joining us on this exciting journey for 2015.
