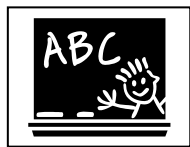

Thank you... we have seen some of the most amazing homework over the last couple of weeks, from 3D skeletons with moving limbs, to stop motion animation of a child learning their spellings, to outstanding illuminated letters which children had clearly taken huge time and care over.

We have also been really pleased with the percentage of children who are doing all of their homework, going over and above expectations and the proactive approach some children are taking to learning spellings – writing them over and over as well as trying out other ways to learn them and getting parents to help with little tests. The new times tables books in lower school have raised great enthusiasm with some brilliant results in classes today too.

We know there is huge evidence to support the fact that children who are well supported at home, perform better in school. We really feel the level of parental support has been exceptional since returning to school this year, so thank you as always for your continued and consistent support.



A note about parking from the School Governors.

We have been made aware that some parents/carers are parking on the double yellow lines outside of the school gates and turning in the school gateway during pick up - both at 3.30pm and at 4.30pm.

Please be reminded that the double yellow lines are there for the children's safety.

There are sometimes as many as 120 children leaving through the main school entrance/gateway at 4.30pm which makes this as an **extremely dangerous turning area** indeed. Please, for the sake of the children, do not continue to do this.

We would strongly recommend using the turning area (yellow criss-crossed spot) instead of the gateway, and not continuing along Gilmore Lane past the zebra crossing.

We will shortly be erecting new signs along Gilmore Lane and in the turning area as a reminder.
