

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We started this half-term by telling parents about the highlights of the last year, what we have achieved and how we look forward to building on that during 2015.

I am really pleased to be able to finish the half-term telling you of a further accolade in our increasing repertoire.

This week we have had our re-assessment for Dyslexia Friendly Status which takes place every 3 years. The assessor was so impressed by what she saw on her tour round school and speaking to staff that she recommend we consider 'Enhanced' Status. Our assessment report is incredibly positive and confirms we meet every criterion with a great number of additional strengths highlighted. She will be coming back on 1st April to conduct an assessment for the 'Enhanced' Status, and has recommended we host a network event to share our good practice with other local primary schools.



Mrs Haywood (SENCO) has led the work and improvements in this area for a number of years, such recognition is further evidence that the leadership team are continually striving for further improvement even once high standards have already been met.

Mrs Haywood has adapted to significant changes to her role over the last couple of years. Previously responsible for one-to-one and small group work, she has now returned to whole class teaching five days per week. She has thoroughly enjoyed the challenges that this brings, whilst careful management has ensured we can maintain momentum across our SEN department too.
