In the kitchen, we have Mrs Brammer (centre), Mrs Roach (left) and Mrs Savings (right). The ladies cook fresh for two sittings each day to ensure the best menu choices are available for all of our children. The menus are based on a



selection of nutritionally balanced options, tweaked to accommodate your children's favourites with some special treats occasionally too. By being flexible in our approach we hope our children learn to make



sensible choices and also grow in confidence to try new foods and flavours that they may not be sure about

If you log on to ParentPay, you will see that the menus have been uploaded to help keep parents informed about what their children are eating and to allow them to support children in their choices. Please inform the school office via ParentPay of any changes to the days on which your child has dinners. This can be done by selecting 'I want to' from the home screen, then 'View Communication' then 'Contact School'

In the dinner hall and on the playground we have Mrs Sawbridge, Mrs Warner, Mrs Robinson, Mrs Vardy, Mrs Da Rosa and Mrs Gadsby. We operate a rota system for dinner sittings so that all children get equal chance to come in for their dinner first. Our lunchtime supervisors monitor children eating, encourage good manners and clean tables between sittings. I can assure you it is no mean feat to feed 240 children within an hour when the hall is used as a classroom until 10 minutes before lunch and

PE lessons begin again as soon as lunchtime is over!!

In addition the lunchtime team supervise games on the playground, help to resolve friendship issues and deal with first aid requirements as well as ensuring the smooth running of the lunch hour.

Parental understanding of the difficulty of this task is very welcome.
