Menu matters!

Those of you who keep up to date with Parent Forum information will know that the school raised concerns during the last meeting regarding catering issues.

We have two excellent cooks in Mrs Brammer and Mrs Roach, and they have always been passionate about cooking tasty, healthy food that the children enjoy.

Our concerns include the questionable appeal of the new menu, the lack of flexibility in ingredient choices and recipe constraints, and that Chartwells' prices are due to rise to £2.20 from the 1st April 2016.

The children have told us that the new menu is leaving some of them not enjoying their meals and / or not having access to as wide a variety of options as they have had in the past. We are unhappy to pass on increasing costs to parents at a time of decreasing satisfaction from the children.

We are seeing a drop in the number of children taking school dinners and feel the two problems outlined above will only compound this issue further.

We have been exploring a number of different options to address this situation, including discussions with senior managers at Chartwells as well as meetings / discussions with other catering companies.
