

## Parent Forum

For many years now at Thomas Russell Junior, we have run a very effective and productive Parent Forum. We would now like to extend a warm invite to parents to form the new Parent Forum for the next academic year; whether you are new to the school, a previous volunteer or just have some great suggestions that you think could help us to get even better.

The remit of the Parent Forum is to focus on whole school improvement and wider issues. It is an opportunity to gauge parental opinion on a range of aspects of school and to take feedback from both members and the wider parent body.

You can keep up to date with current topics and progress of the Parent Forum, via our noticeboard in the entrance hall and the Parent Forum section of the website. If you have an individual or personal issue / comment, we would still encourage you to come directly to us, either through your child's class teacher or to myself, in order that we may be able to discuss and address this as quickly as possible.

We are asking parents to e-mail an 'Expression of Interest' to '[questions@](mailto:questions@)' if they would be interested in forming part of the Parent Forum. All nominations will go into a hat and two representatives from each class will be randomly selected, to give a forum of sixteen parents plus governor and staff representation. We intend that the Parent Forum will meet 3 times during the year, once per term. These meetings will be during the school day, starting at 9:00am and lasting approximately 60-90 minutes. The dates have been set as Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> November, Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February and Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June.

We would also welcome your input if you have an item that you would like discussed at the Parent Forum, but do not wish to be a representative. Pleasingly we already have two topics for discussion that have been raised, but the more the merrier!

The deadline for submission of 'Expression of Interest' e-mails is Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> October. All parents submitting messages will be contacted in writing to inform them of the outcome of the draw. The names of successful nominees only will go on the weekly Newsletter.

## CENSUS 2016

This year it is necessary for school's to include within their census more detailed information than has previously been collected from parents. We are required to add **Country of Birth** and **Nationality** to all pupil's records. For ease of data collection we intend to add:

Country of Birth - United Kingdom

Nationality - British

## Behaviour

I am pleased to report that since we returned to school, the children's behaviour has been consistently good.

We have 5 Golden Rules in school which are:

**We try our best and work hard**

**We are friendly, kind and helpful**

**We respect property**

**We listen to people**

**We are polite and have good manners**

96% of children have retained all of their Golden Time during this first month, which we believe is testament to the high standards of behaviour we see on a daily basis.

At Thomas Russell Junior School, we believe passionately that ALL of our children have the right to come to school and feel safe every day. They should be free from fear of being hurt, physically or emotionally, by anyone; and safe to blossom in an amazing learning environment.

We have a zero-tolerance policy on fighting (including play fighting), bullying and swearing.

When we receive reports of children having difficulties, these are dealt with by speaking to the children involved, monitoring playground behaviour closely, liaising with class teachers and parents. Please be assured that we encourage our children (and you as parents) to report any incident to us so we can investigate thoroughly. However, as I'm sure you appreciate, the more time that lapses between an incident and report, the more difficult investigation becomes. Sometimes investigation leads us to the conclusion that two children have a very different recollection of a sequence of events; this can be difficult to bring to a satisfactory conclusion for both parties. We encourage children to report any problems to a member of staff as soon as they arise. If you are aware of a problem, please do not allow it to build up before bringing it to us. We will always do our best to resolve issues promptly.

We know that sometimes the children we see at school can be very different to the children that parents see at home. We also understand as parents it can be difficult to hear that your child has been involved in poor behaviour, but sadly it does happen. We will endeavour to deliver the information as sensitively as possible and by dealing with issues consistently and fairly, with good communication between home and school, we hope to help our children to modify their behaviour and thrive in a happy, safe and positive environment.
