#ready for transition - team Y5/6

At this time of year, there can be a temptation to think that schools take their foot off the pedal and relax into summer! I can assure parents that this could not be further from the truth - in actual fact this is the time that we continue to step up the pace and expectation to ensure all of our children are fully prepared for the next academic year.

This year we have decided to implement something more creative to meet two objectives:

- Y5 children will know that Mrs Mosedale left at Easter and this has left Y5 in two much larger classes for core subjects.
- For Y6 children, we had feedback in our transition questionnaire that getting organised at John
 Taylor with books and stationery, moving around classrooms and meeting lots of different
 teachers and students in a day took some getting used to.

Over the next 5 weeks, children in Y5 and 6 will be spending their maths lessons in mixed Y5/6 groups. Each ability group will be taught by each teacher throughout the 5 weeks. Mrs Kerr-Delworth is leading the team in planning and preparing a range of differentiated lessons and activities.

For Y6 this will provide an opportunity to emulate the experiences ready for September - moving rooms, changing teachers, mixing with different children and giving them a chance to polish their understanding of what it means to make a good 'first impression'.

For Y5 this will enable us to share the expertise and knowledge from Y6 pupils, provide smaller group teaching which has proven so effective and also give children a head start to meet the challenges of Y6.

PARENT GOVERNOR ELECTION

Today the school is announcing an election for a parent governor. After four years of service to the school Mr Jonathan Cunningham has decided not to seek re-election due to his work commitments. The school thanks him for the work and support he has provided during his tenure. This therefore gives an opportunity for someone else to become more closely involved with the school.

The Governing Body has a responsibility to inform parents of any existing skills or knowledge that we would particularly welcome.

Mr Cunningham's departure creates a need for someone to take the lead governor role for the very important area of **SAFEGUARDING** involving child protection, Looked After Children and the Government's PREVENT strategy. It is anticipated that the new governor would also be a member of the Finance Committee. In addition, all governors are encouraged to take an interest in general school and governance issues. The Governing Body would therefore particularly welcome the election of someone with prior knowledge or experience of **Safeguarding**. Any background in, or knowledge of, finance/banking or wider school and governance issues would be a bonus.
