# <u>Be Bright, Be Seen</u>



On Monday we held a 'Be Bright, Be Seen' assembly to remind children about the importance of being visible when out and about, particularly with the darker nights approaching.

Your child will have brought home a reflective badge that can be attached to their school bag or coat. Please help your child in positioning the badge so that it is visible.

We have also sent home a travel diary. We would like to encourage all children to walk to school. Whilst we are aware that it is not always possible for the children to walk to school from home, we would like to remind them that cars can be parked a 10 minute walk away from school so that they can walk part of the way. As well as this forming part of a healthy lifestyle, we would like to reduce the traffic congestion around the school area.

Question: "Hi, I think I'm right in saying that girls aren't allowed their hair down at school, does this include a half up and half down hairstyle please? Thanks"

Answer: You are right, children are not allowed their hair down at school if it is long enough to tie up.

The half up, half down style is often adopted by children when their hair isn't quite long enough to go up completely. If children's hair is long enough to all tie up, then we do ask them to do so.

There are a number of reasons for this:

Firstly, it removes the temptation to play with it during lessons times and helps to ensure children can see their work clearly.

Secondly, it helps with health and safety around play equipment and in practical lessons such as DT and Science. Thirdly it helps to reduce / stop the spread of headlice which are thankfully now a very rare occurrence in school, rather than a weekly visitor!
