<u>Doctor Who - Space, Light and Super Movers - Live Lesson</u> On Tuesday afternoon, Year 6 participated in a Doctor Who BBC Live Lesson. Their main challenge was to help the Doctor move a planet (Tenebrous) out of the way of the Earth's sunlight as it was orbiting at the same time as Earth.

During this lesson, Year 6 learnt a series of facts about transparent, translucent and opaque objects; the order of the planets; and The

Milky Way. They were given a number of activities to complete such as checking the properties of materials e.g. if they were translucent or not by using beanbags. In addition, Year 6 were also allowed to showcase their dance moves with the Super Movers.
