I am pleased to update you that following assessment yesterday we have been successful in achieving the award. The assessor said we were "an outstanding example of Enhanced status" and we have no recommendations for further improvements.

We join a very elite group of only six schools in Staffordshire (out of 426) who have met this standard. Unfortunately as yet there isn't a new logo for the standard, but we've suggested this one would look nice! What do you think?!? Congratulations again to Mrs Haywood and the staff, but also to the children who spoke knowledgeably and confidently about the difficulties associated with dyslexia, triumphs of well-known people who have succeeded with dyslexia and also about the wider picture of child development at Thomas Russell Junior School that is supported through School Council, Eco Warriors and a whole host of work with teachers and TAs.
