Multi Academy Trust

Governors of Thomas Russell Junior School are aware of the national debate regarding the issue of schools converting to academy status. John Taylor High School has put forward proposals for the formation of a Multi Academy Trust (MAT). Local schools are thinking about what is in the best interests of the children at their schools.

TRJS Governors continually monitor changes in the local area, as well as national developments, and have decided that we will not immediately be seeking to become an Academy or join any MAT.

We will review these decisions on an on-going basis and if there comes a time when we believe such a conversion is right for the children in our school, we will then take the necessary action.

Payment Reminder

It is essential that prompt payment is made. If you haven't already done so, please pay via Parent Pay.

I am very pleased to say the vast majority of parents pay promptly each term and would like to thank you for that. Equally we don't mind if one or two parents accidentally forget and require a reminder, then pay promptly.

However a small persistent group require multiple texts, written notes and phone call reminders which causes unnecessary strain on administration. We are unable to continue to provide school dinners for children where debt has reached £25 and will insist on sandwiches being provided until the account is in credit.

My Money Week

2015 marks the seventh annual My Money Week, which will take place across the UK from 8^{th} to the 14^{th} June.

My Money Week is the highest profile and most recognised financial education initiative. In all year groups our teachers have planned a range of informative, imaginative and creative activities to help increase the children's financial awareness.

We will be providing fantastic opportunities for our pupils to gain the skills, knowledge and confidence in money matters to thrive in our society. Please talk to the children about what they are learning to help them really deepen their understanding.

Big First Aid Lesson

On Friday 12th June we will be joining St John Ambulance Big First Aid Lesson. In the space of just one hour our children will learn first aid skills that could stay with them for a lifetime.

The online first aid session will be streamed live and direct into classrooms across the country. The interactive programme combines first aid training, 999 scenarios with amazing real life stories, and opportunities for our students to join the conversation.

We share St John Ambulance belief that everyone should get the chance to learn first aid. It is so easy to learn and can have an incredible impact.

First aid is not compulsory on the National Curriculum, in fact, across the country, in a 2014 survey nearly 60% of children had no first aid training whatsoever.

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First aid gives young people something amazing – the confidence to do the right thing when it really counts.

The BIG First Aid Lesson is the culmination of first aid learning throughout the school. Y4,5 & 6 have completed the more advanced course having completed a basic course last year. Again, please take time to talk to the children about what they have learnt, as we all know shared learning between home and school has the greatest impact on the children.
