

SATs Results

I am incredibly pleased to report that our SATs results have come back into school this week. The table below shows how well our children have achieved in comparison to the national figures from 2014. Our children have worked **incredibly hard**, not just during Y6 but throughout their time here to ensure we have been able to secure the **best progress** data the school has ever seen. Thank you primarily to the children, but to all the staff and parents who have supported their success.

You will notice we have also made great progress in one of the areas Ofsted gave as to why we were not yet Outstanding: Pupils' attainment and progress in writing remains behind that in reading. This year the gap in attainment has been closed at L4, reduced at L5 and progress rates have increased at L4 and increased significantly at L5. Happy Days!
