I would like to remind parents that Parent Pay accounts for <u>dinner</u> money should be kept in <u>credit</u>.

If your child has dinners every day, a credit balance of £23.90 will last them until October half term holiday.



### "Are you ok?"

Year 6 spent this morning working together on issues relating to mental health. We talked about asking someone, "Are you ok?" twice, as you are more likely to get their honest answer. We also shared our highs and lows and what makes us feel better if we are feeling down.

#### Residential Visits

Each year we give Y4, Y5 and Y6 children the opportunity to attend a residential visit. We believe these are brilliant opportunities for children to develop a whole host of skills as well as try new activities and create memories that last a lifetime. However, we appreciate that they also come at a cost and we wouldn't be able to provide such brilliant experiences if it wasn't for parental contributions, for which we are really grateful.

Again, we have tried to look for opportunities which we feel provide the best range or experiences and activities, whilst also providing good value for money. Please note, in our attempt to keep costs as low as we can (and similar to last year), the school has subsidised each child's place to a similar value.

Y4 have a chance to go to Shugborough for 2 days - 23rd to 24th March 2020

Y5 have a chance to go to Shugborough for 4 days - 24th to 27th March 2020

Y6 have a chance to go to Standon Bowers for 3 days - 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> June 2020

To secure your child's place on any of these visits, we are asking for a non-refundable deposit to be paid in the next 4-6 weeks. For each trip, it is possible to pay in £5 instalments from today - we hope this will help with saving as we understand budgeting for unexpected events can be tricky.

#### Table Tennis coaching

On Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September, Oliver R-6P, Harrison L-6P, Ellisia R-6P, Holly B-6M, Silver T-J-5M, Seb J-5M, all went to John Taylor High School to have a table tennis session with the national, regional, county, professional table tennis player: Dan. A. Along with him was Mrs Berry, Miss Press and two other teachers from the other schools, all there to supervise all of us. There were two other schools along with us: Mary Howard and Mosely.

Whilst we were at the table tennis session, we played matches, although it was not a competition. First of all, the county player (Dan. A) told us to get into partners. #### **School Crossing Patrol**

Two locations in Barton under Needwood: Efflinch Lane - Gilmour Lane - Short Lane Salary: Variable hours and rates dependent on location (see below for more details)

Are you looking for a part-time job that gives you the chance to serve your local community? If so, we might have the ideal opportunity for you.

Staffordshire County Council operates a School Crossing Patrol Service to assist school children and pedestrians on their journey to and from school. We regularly have vacancies for School Crossing Patrols throughout the County and would be pleased to hear from you if you may be interested in doing this essential work. The duties are term time only and are therefore ideally suited to anyone who prefers to take school holidays.

Post holders will receive full training and uniform, and payment throughout the year.

The successful candidate will be required to attend a Health Assessment carried out by Staffordshire County Councils' Occupational Health Department.

We currently have vacancies for School Crossing Patrols, and Relief School Crossing Patrols such as: Local Relief Patrols - vehicle not essential, and Mobile Relief Patrols - vehicle and full driving licence essential.

School Crossing Patrols operate twice daily during term-time. Duty times usually fall between the following times: 8am - 9am and 3pm - 4pm, and each duty can last from 30mins up to 1 hours in length, but each crossing location is unique and has its own specific operating times (some locations may fall outside of these times, please check with the School Crossing Patrol team for individual crossing information).
