Passwords

We sent individual Microsoft 365 and Charanga log in details to every child this week via parents' e-mail. We have asked parents to check these work because we know some children have already used these accounts in the past and may have changed their passwords, but not remembered them. Thank you to those who have checked if they are working. If you have yet to do so, please give it a try over the weekend. If it does not work, drop us an e-mail to questions@thomasrussell-junior.staffs.sch.uk and let us know. We will reset all of those that need it on Monday and resend information asap.

It is not our intention to move our teaching to Teams, however Micrososft 365 gives children free access to the latest versions of Word, Excel, PowerPoint etc. which may help with access to the teaching resources on the website. Microsoft 365 also offers additional features such as storage and sharing of documents, so going forward it may be useful for children to have access to these facilities.

We are really grateful for all of the amazing feedback we have received and delighted to hear not only how much the children are enjoying their Zoom sessions but how they are helping to keep them motivated and connected to school, as well as how much parents appreciate the support.

As well as celebrating what has gone well, we know it is also important to reflect on ways we could make things even better. We are looking at ways to reduce the use of zipped files, as we know these can be difficult to access on some devices and also doing our best to reduce printing requirements for those who do not have reliable access to printing. I hope that the Microsoft 365 access will help where children didn't have the latest version of Office so were unable to play PowerPoints. Please do keep talking to us if there are further ways that we can help.

We will continue to e-mail Zoom codes separately, directly to parents. Although we understand it may appear more streamlined to have these on the Weekly Overviews and Assembly Information on the website, it would not be right to allow worldwide public access to these codes. I am sure you understand and agree with us protecting our children in this manner.

Don't believe everything you hear in the News!

There has been lots of talk in the news this week about **Free School Meals** and the inadequacy of some food packages provided. As often happens, the very worst examples hit the news and are shared nationwide, these can cloud people's perceptions or understanding of what is happening in the vast majority of schools.

At Thomas Russell Junior (similar to a large percentage of schools across the county) we are providing a £15 voucher, per child, per week, to be spent at a supermarket of choice (purchase restrictions apply). Although the Government's voucher system is not expected to be up and running until at least next week, we implemented these vouchers within hours of the lockdown being announced.

We have been really pleased over the last few months to see an increase in people claiming the Free School Meals to which they are entitled. There is no need to feel any embarrassment about doing the right thing to ensure your children are properly provided for. We can assure you the information is handled very discreetly in school. If you think there is a chance you might be entitled, please follow the link below and complete the application. It takes about five minutes and you will receive an immediate decision.
