- b) Accept any correct explanation. Example answer: I know that the hundreds column must have had another hundred regrouped from the tens column because $5 + 2$ does not make 8. This means that the missing digit in the tens column must have been 7, to make 14 tens overall. I found the missing digit in the ones column by working out that $8 - 5 = 3$.
