World Book Day turned in to a week with fun activities based around books happening all week. Miss Murfin will be giving out World Book Day vouchers on Monday which children can put towards the cost of a book, or claim their free book. On Monday morning, Year 4 had the chance to 'meet' the author Rashmi Sirdeshpande. Rashmi shared part of her book 'How to Change the World' and discussed the ideas of collaboration and activism. She explained that every single person has the ability to make a positive difference. Rashmi also told the children all about what it is like to be an author through answering the



children's questions on subjects such as what inspires her, how she comes up with ideas, how long it takes to write a book, how a book is a result of working collaboratively as part of a team and how important illustrators are in bringing a story to life. The children were lucky enough to be given some top tips about what to do if they get stuck, how to plan a story and how to make their writing even better. 
We enjoyed some successes. Class 6P were the highest performing class in the battle (out of 53 classes) and 4P and 4H achieved 6th and 7th place respectively.


A special well done to these three players.

The information below has not changed from last week, but I just thought some might appreciate having it to hand:

Return to school ©

We are now **delighted**, but <u>cautious</u>, to welcome all children back to school from Monday 8th March. It is our intention to return in class bubbles for at least the first four weeks up to Easter. We will continue with the staggered arrival that we had in place previously, with Upper School encouraged to arrive between 8:40 and 8:50, then Lower School between 8:50 and 9:00. The school day will end at 3:20 for Upper School and 3:30 for Lower School. Please could we reiterate our request for all adults to wear a mask whilst on site and in busy areas outside of school around Gilmour Lane.

We would like children to return in full school uniform, however totally appreciate that some may have had growth spurts and things like school shoes may no longer fit - we are happy to offer a short period of flexibility to allow for any shopping trips etc. that are required.

With regard to shoe shopping, please could we make one request and that is to avoid purchasing

With regard to shoe shopping, please could we make one request and that is to avoid purchasing open toe sandals or very flimsy ballet pumps? We find these do not protect children's feet very well at all when they are running around on the playground and field. It is our intention to make as much use as possible of the wonderful outdoor space we have, which will include accessing the field regularly. Shoes that are a little more substantial offer better protection and will also keep feet much drier if the grass is a bit damp.

Please could we request that children continue to attend in Games Kit one day per week: Y3 on Friday, Y4 & Y6 on Thursday, Y5 on Wednesday.

It is our intention to keep protective measures in place at a heightened level - this will keep all of our children and staff as safe as possible. These include: individual stationery sets provided for every child, seats in a pew and aisle arrangement facing the front of the class, regular hand washing, regular sanitation of touch points, promoting respiratory hygiene through 'catch-it, bin-it, kill-it' and well ventilated classroom with doors and windows open as much as possible. All staff will be following social distancing measures and wearing masks / visors where this isn't possible.

We will be serving hot dinners from 8th March and will assume your child will be following their previous pattern, unless you inform us otherwise via lpatrick@thomasrussell-junior.staffs.sch.uk

During this initial return period, we are very keen to avoid possible transmission of the virus between home and school and would therefore like to request that minimal belongings are brought in to school, however if children require a school bag to safely carry items, then this is acceptable.

We are anticipating the first couple of weeks might be quite exhausting for some as they re-adjust to being back in school full time, increased levels of physical activity, changes in bedtime and daily routines and prolonged periods of concentration in the classroom. Our focus will be on social aspects of learning, understanding and regulating emotions, re-integrating with peers in the classroom and on the playground.
