Activity 1:

Guided Reading. Read chapter 10 of either War Horse or Kensuke's Kingdom and discuss some of the questions in the planning.

Activity 2:

Read through the lesson plan for Wednesday (page 1).

Next, use *Letter Planner* (page 4) to plan a letter to send to Eric (imagine you are the narrator of the story). Think about including noun phrases, relative clauses, prepositional phrases and semi-colons for clauses.

Solving Equations

Express missing number problems algebraically is explained on p.2 - p.4. Remember that a letter and a number 'stuck' together means multiply:

e.g. $5a = 100$

$5 \times a = 100$ therefore $a = 20$.

And remember that the angles in a triangle always add up to 180° and the angles inside a quadrilateral add up to 360°

There are some 'Mild' solving equations on p.6 and 'Hot' on p.7.

Algebra making your head ache a bit? Then p.9 is for you: it will hopefully make it all much clearer!

The difference between the two smaller numbers is 2.</p> <p>What are the numbers? And can you work it out algebraically?</p> <p><i>This problem is taken from the World Mathematics Championships</i></p>
Lunchtime!	<p>Play Jumping Beans:</p> <p>Take it in turns to shout out a type of bean and do the activity for 30 seconds.</p> <p>Baked bean - crouch down into a ball.</p> <p>Runner bean - run on the spot.</p> <p>Jumping bean - jump on the spot.</p> <p>Magic bean - freestyle move.</p> <p>Can you think of any other type of bean you could make a move to?</p>

You might like to make a botanical drawing that is as realistic as possible, like a sketch you might find in a science book... (if you are not sure what a botanical drawing is Google it).</p> <p>...Or</p> <p>You might like to arrange some plants as a still life...</p> <p>...Or</p> <p>You could make up some completely imaginary plants and draw those!</p> <p>Have fun!</p> <p>Remember to think about shading, colour choice and really look hard at the plant so your drawing can be as realistic as possible.</p>
