Alternatively, have a go at the fiction comprehension task.</p> <p><b><u>Activity 2:</u></b></p> <p>Read through Friday's lesson plan - page 1.</p> <p>First, look at <i>Images 1-4 (page 2-5)</i>. How would you describe what they show? What can you notice that maybe someone else wouldn't? Where in the story do they come? Watch the story being read again. Watch out for Images 1-4.
