Finished? Then try this:

Melons: 95p each

Tomatoes: 70p per kg

Pineapples: £1.37 each

Grapes: £3.80 per kg

Nectarines: 45p each

Leeks: £1.30 per kg

Brussel Sprouts: 60p per $\frac{1}{2}$ kg

Person 1: I bought a pineapple and two melons.

Person 2: I bought 1kg of tomatoes and three nectarines.

Person 3: I bought 1kg of grapes and 1kg of sprouts.

Person 4: I bought 3kg of leeks, 1 kg of grapes and a melon.

Person 5: I bought 3kg of tomatoes, two pineapples and one melon.

Person 6: I bought $\frac{1}{2}$ kg of tomatoes, 2kg of sprouts and two pineapples.

Work out how much each person spent.
