
WHEN AND HOW TO PAY

There is **NO** additional charge for those children who normally have a school dinner.

- 1. If you pay <u>WEEKLY</u> you should pay the usual amount of £10.50 via <u>Parent Pay</u> on Monday 14th December.
- 2. If your child normally has sandwiches the cost of a Christmas Lunch is £2.10. You will need to pay this by Tuesday 8th December via Parent Pay, in order that the kitchen knows how many children they are catering for.
- 3. If your child requires a vegetarian meal or there is any other information you wish to inform us about please contact the office via Parent Pay. This can be done by selecting 'I want to' from the home screen, then 'View Communication' then 'Contact School'

Please note: this year we will be asking the children to select their pudding choice in school.

Governors at TRJS

As you will recall we have <u>two</u> vacancies on the Governing Body, one co-opted vacancy and an elected parent governor.

We are very keen to hear from any parents who are interested in taking on one of these roles, and can assure you of support, training and advice to help you learn the role.

Parent Forum

We had our first Parent Forum meeting on Wednesday 25th November at 9am. Firstly I would like to say thank you for the number of items that were brought to our attention for discussion. The purpose behind such a forum is to be able to share ideas for discussion resulting in better systems and improved communication.



Minutes of our meeting will be available to view on the website and on the Parent Forum noticeboard in due course.

- School Photos some parents were concerned about limited options and the cost of buying multiple packages when they had siblings in school. Wrates are willing to manipulate packages so, should you wish to purchase different options to those advertised, please do contact them directly to discuss.
- Monthly collection for YMCA following an incredible response at our Harvest Festival, some parents felt
 they would like to continue to support our chosen charity on an ongoing basis. This will be co-ordinated by a
 group of parent volunteers, so listen out for further details.
- School mini-bus we discussed the significant costs of such an investment and also the ongoing costs and legal requirements. It was decided that whilst it might be a nice idea to have a minibus, the costs make it unfeasible. However, school will consider the hire of a mini-bus when appropriate. Also to address transport issues, it was decided that the selected team for each sporting event will be included in the letter detailing the event to help parents organising lift shares and ensure all children can be included, if they wish.
- Lights on Gilmore Lane and outside of school Mr Harper has repaired all of the lights around the front of school. The school has paid to have the lights on Gilmour Lane repaired on numerous occasions, regularly to have them vandalised soon after. Given that school does not require street lights, it is questionable whether these should continue to be paid from the ever decreasing school budget, or whether they should be maintained by another village funding source, since they are for villagers use during dark evenings and nights. This matter is to be pursued further and any updates will be notified to parents.
 - Autumn Fair without a Friends Association, this has been one of the events that we have needed to
 postpone. There was a strong feeling amongst the Forum that, having had a year with school staff taking
 the key roles of a Friends Association, these roles should now be taken back by parents, reflecting the
 wealth of support given to the school. We know that whilst the events are beneficial for the funds they
 raise and the enjoyment for the children, they are also a vital link to bring the communities together.
 Parents also voiced their embarrassment that a school this size, in a village like Barton can't muster the
 necessary support.
- Open Morning for New Y3 Parents in September 2016 the date for this has been set for Thursday 7th
 January. Please pass this information to any prospective parents you know. Tours need to be booked by
 contacting the school office.
- Healthy Snacks there was a wide ranging discussion on the matter of what actually constitutes a 'healthy'
 snack. It was agreed that the school continue to make the recommendation that parents send children to
 school with a healthy snack for breaktime, with appropriate choices including:

fresh fruit and vegetables, yoghurt, cheese, healthy cereal bars and snack crackers. It was also agreed that a number of options are marketed as healthy choices, but contain a significant amount of sugar – such as some cereal bars, fruit winders and similar.

Inappropriate choices include: sweets, chocolate and crisps.

Handwriting pens - there seems to be some confusion about the type of pens that children 'have' to have.
We will provide children with a black Handwriting Pen when they achieve a consistently neat, joined writing
style. These pens will be replaced free of charge every time they run out, by bringing the expired pen to
the school office. Lost pens can be replaced at a cost of £1, and again we will continue to replace this free
of charge for as long as children are at school.

There is no expectation that children will have a Frixion pen.

We also discussed the vote for **paper or electronic Newsletter** - we had 65 responses back from parents - 30 say return to paper, 30 say keep electronic and 5 say there are benefits to both. What staff have decided is that we will keep sending it electronically and a paper version will be sent to each classroom, displayed so children can read it whilst on the playground and placed in a folder in the entrance hall.
