## League Tables

League tables showing the performance of 11-year-olds at primary schools across the country were published yesterday by the Department for Education. Pupils take SATs tests to assess Reading, Writing and Maths. Children are expected to reach a Level 4 in all areas; those achieving 4B are classed as 'secondary ready'. Reaching L5 exceeds expectation (representing those working at Y7/8 level).

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#### Friends AGM

There was a strong feeling at Parent Forum that having been without a group of parents to take on the committee roles for a year, now would be a good time to have a relaunch.

We <u>never</u> struggle to rally support for events, but there are many reasons why parents say they find it a struggle to attend meetings. Going forward we would like to make some suggestions to alleviate these struggles.

We think the following should help:

- limit meetings to an hour long as an absolute maximum.
  - hold meetings after school rather than in evening to avoid the need for babysitters and minimise impact on fixed routines such as clubs, evening meal and bedtime.
- provide somewhere for children to go during the meeting which is enjoyable.

Taking these into account, we will be holding the Friends AGM at 3:45 on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup>

January. Mrs Brammer has kindly offered to make a cake for the occasion. We will provide supervision for any children (including younger ones) where they can have cake and a drink and watch a film.

Hopefully this will encourage greater attendance. At this meeting we would like to take nominations for the roles of Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. We also hope to come up with a list of events for the year, a quick 'shopping list' of what needs doing for each event, and a much larger list of people who are happy to be called upon for smaller responsibilities. We should also look at the current funds available to spend, how much recent events and activities have raised and come up with a 'wish list' for purchases for the coming year.

#### Reading Challenge Cards

As part of our drive to encourage children to read a range of texts, we have introduced Free Readers to our Reading Challenge Cards. The cards will be stuck into Reading Records by the children over the next week.

Each box on the card represents a different text type, the challenge for the children is to read one of each text type on the card. Each time they complete a text, we would like parents to initial and highlight the square to show that it has been completed. When the chart is full, the children will be entered into a raffle to win a prize. The prize draw will take place at the end of each school year. On completion of the card, children will be given a new card to challenge themselves with.

Please note that we do not expect parents to buy new books for their children to complete this challenge; each classroom has a selection of books and our library is incredibly well stocked! The library in the village also has a large range of children's books to choose from, or you may find some reading materials as you visit various attractions, etc.
