

SPaG Sentence Types

Simple sentence: A sentence with one clause that stands alone, and makes full and complete sense, e.g. 'I went to the shop.'

Compound sentence: Two simple sentences joined together by a connective, e.g. 'I went to the shop and I bought some milk.'

Complex sentence: A sentence with a subordinate clause that contains extra information, e.g. 'While strolling through the dark streets to the shop, I came across a mysterious figure.'

Identify the sentence type	
I went for a walk.	
Though I need to eat, I don't feel hungry.	
It's been a long day and I feel tired.	
I went to the party, even though I didn't want to.	
Walking is great but it can leave you with sore muscles.
