Christmas Jumpers

Congratulations to Will TW, Beatrice, Cara and Ollie, our School Councillors from Y6 who raised nearly £40 with their Christmas Jumper Sale. We were really pleased to see them developing their entrepreneurial skills as well as helping the environment - win, win!

We still have a few jumpers remaining, which may be especially suitable for Infant Children - call in to the office if interested.

Children are allowed to wear their Christmas Jumpers every day next week with the rest of their uniform – either substitute the green jumper or wear both!

At our recent meeting of the full governing body, a governor raised concerns that were shared with them by a group of parents regarding PE lessons. The governing body have asked me to address the concerns raised via the Newsletter, which I am more than happy to do so. The concern raised was "Why are PE lessons always being cancelled?"

At TRJS we pride ourselves on providing **three** hours of PE per week as opposed to the standard **two** hours offered in the majority of primary schools. This is organised as follows:

- 1x 1 hour swimming lesson
- 1x 1 hour outdoor PE (e.g. football, netball, athletics or golf)
- 1 x 1hour indoor PE (e.g. gymnastics, dance, boccia or dodgeball)







The PE days for each year group are organised at the start of the year – if you are unsure on which days your child has PE, please do contact their class teacher who will clarify this for you.

We always do our utmost to ensure that PE time is not lost. Our main reason for having to cancel outdoor PE is due to the weather. Unfortunately, we are unable to move outdoor PE slots into the hall as invariably another year group is already using the hall for their indoor PE. If this is the case, where possible, we may offer an alternative in the classroom such as Go Noodle or Just Dance.

Following the question being raised at governors, I have spoken to each year group to confirm how many lessons have been cancelled this year. I am satisfied that each year group has indeed had to cancel lessons, but that this is a small number in each case. The reasons for lessons being cancelled this term are as follows:

Weather (snow/ice/heavy rain) - As I am sure you can appreciate, we always put the health and safety of our children first and as such if the weather conditions are deemed to be unsafe we will not take the children outside.

Visitors to school – We have recently had transition meetings for Y6 and an art expert visit Y4. These are both valuable opportunities for our children and we had to take the decision to add them into our time tables at a mutually convenient point.

How can parents help? Please always send your child into school appropriately dressed for the weather – layers are particularly helpful at this time of year. If your child has indoor PE please still send them in with joggers and a jumper as we are keeping the doors open in the hall for added ventilation during Covid.


Christmas Countdown Top of The Rocks Battle - Interim Summary

We are now nearly half way through our 11-day battle against 5 other local primary schools: Tower View, Holy Rosary, Christ Church Primary, Burton Fields and Rykneld Primary. After our strong performances in previous battles, we knew that the other schools would be working hard to beat us.

As of 8.00am today, two of our children are in the top 10 (out of 770 who are taking part) which is a brilliant performance by them. We are familiar with these names from previous competitions: Fee Rock (aka Robert B) is in 2nd place and has earned a massive 18,620 points and Axle Keene (aka Isaac O) is in 6th place with 10,130 points. Their performance has been fabulous but they need your help too!

When looking at scores by class, two of our classes make it into the top 10: 5M in 4^{th} place and 6P in 5^{th} place with 6R just outside in 12^{th} place. Well done to these children. It would be lovely to see more TRJS classes making it into top ten positions by the end of the competition.

Overall, we are currently in second place behind Christ Chuch Primary School who have a sizeable lead with an average score per person of 1,931 compared to TRJS average score of 701. Very close behind us in 3^{rd} position is Rykneld Primary with an average 569 points per child. Whilst Christ Church's lead is not insurmountable, we will need to all work together if we are to stand a chance of claiming first place and to keep Rykneld from passing us.



The competition ends at 6.30pm on Thursday 16th of December and there's still all to play for. So far, 129 TRJS children have played. If you are one of the children who haven't yet joined in, please log in and do your bit. The points are averaged across all children in the school – not just those who play – so we need everyone to take part if we want to win.

Well done to everyone who has played so far. Keep going and let's work together to get to the top spot. We can do it!


Early Birds and Night Owls
