As your children may have been excited to tell you, we have been busy with a number of other 'new' things. Our children's toilets throughout school have been replaced. This much needed refurbishment was planned with the School Council last year, and although they're not 100% complete yet, they are already much cleaner, brighter and more energy efficient.

Our swimming pool has been relined too, an expensive project paid for by funds raised in hiring out the pool for commercial use. We realise that as a junior school we are incredibly privileged to have an onsite swimming pool and thankful to the Pool Management Committee (made up of Governors) who help to ensure its financial stability and profitability.

In classrooms, we have had all of the blinds replaced – a much needed project which will help with privacy for changing, keeping rooms cool for work in the hot summer months, and allowing best use of the interactive whiteboards too.

Finally, we are delighted to have taken delivery of two brand new sets of iPads. One of these has been funded with profits from our Early Birds and Night Owls childcare. The other set has been purchased with a generous donation from Tippers Builders Merchants. We are very grateful for this and know they will be put to good use in supporting the children's learning.

If there are any parents who work for or own companies that may offer match funding or charitable donations, then we would be very happy to hear from you to discuss potential future projects.
