


Anti-bullying Week

This week we have been participating in national Anti-Bullying Week with activities and discussion around 'reaching out' to ask for help, being a good ally and the power of kindness in what we say and do. We reminded each other of the definition of bullying:

Bullying is the **repetitive**, **intentional hurting** of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an **imbalance of power**. It can happen face to face or online.

or put simply in the TRJS way as 'STOP: Several Times On Purpose'. We also learnt that bullying can be a group behaviour, with people taking on different roles:



School Council met with Miss Branson to discuss what bullying is, what teachers and pupils do to help stop bullying, and what more school could do for anti-bullying. This was also discussed throughout school in our whole school and class assemblies.

Over the year, we will be taking part in the United Against Bullying anti-bullying programme provided by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. The views of the children are vitally important in making sure that we are doing all we can to prevent and reduce bullying and to improve pupil wellbeing. As such, we are inviting all pupils to complete an anonymous survey. The multiple-choice answers your child gives to the questionnaire will not be seen by their friends, teachers or parents. We will then ask pupils to complete the questionnaire again in the Summer term to see how the work we have done made has had an impact.

We are sending home a paper letter today that has more information about the anti-bullying programme and questionnaire. If you do <u>not</u> wish your child to answer the questionnaire, please sign and return the form to school by Friday 25th November. If you are happy for your child to participate, no action is needed.

Charlotte E in Y6 shared a lovely phrase in assembly '**Kindness in contagious**' and this is a theme that has really resonated with us. We are working with the children to recognise kindness in all areas of our school community. We are asking children to make their nominations when they have seen, heard or benefitted from kindness. The first nomination I have already received from another pupil is for Jessica E in 3K – for always being kind to everyone in her class. These 'kindnesses' will be collected to form a huge paper chain.

We have discussed these themes in our staff meeting this week. We are also concerned how computer gaming and social media are playing a negative role in affecting children's behaviours towards each other, by normalising violence, hostility and physical aggression. I have included a couple of Information Posters for parents about risks associated with AMONG US (7) and Call of Duty (18).

Christmas Jumper Juggle

As we continue to make plans for Christmas, I wonder if I could kindly ask for any donations of Christmas jumpers? Y6 School Councillors last year ran a 'Jumper Juggle', and this year's Y6 School Councillors would love to do the same - selling donated jumpers for £2 each to raise money towards our cinema trip.

There will be a jumper donation box in the entrance hall for the next couple of weeks. On Thursday 1st December, the councillors will set up tables of jumpers sorted by size, by the front of school at the end of the day. Hopefully, if we can get a nice lot of donations, it should be a good chance to do something eco-friendly too \odot

The successful applicant will work alongside a knowledgeable and committed team, supporting children with additional learning needs of all abilities. Experience of implementation of wave 2 and 3 intervention strategies would be welcome, but is by no means essential. The ability to use your initiative and a high level of subject knowledge in both English (Reading, Writing and SPAG) and Maths is an absolute necessity. Applications are welcome from all good or outstanding teaching assistants, regardless of qualification. Flexibility, resourcefulness and a shared commitment to supporting our children to achieve their full potential are essential. Training will be available for the successful applicant.

Primarily we are looking for a TA to work during mornings supporting core lessons in Maths and English, with two lunchtimes supporting specific children with social interactions, developing friendships and playing games. Working hours will be spread over 5 days during the week and can be flexible to allow for school drop off and pick up responsibilities you may have.

We also have a post available for a <u>Lunchtime Supervisor</u>, which may be combined with this role for the other 3 lunchtimes per week, giving an additional 4.5 hours.

Applicants are required to fully complete an application form and are also asked to state strengths and experience within their letter (no more than 2 sides of A4). Please do not include CVs (these will not be looked at).
