
### **TT Rockstars Year Group Battle Results**

Well done to the 176 children who took part in our latest battle. © There have been some fabulous performances in all year groups.

The top ten was dominated by our Y6 children with Lo-Fi Ranks (aka Zachai K.) in first place with a massive 42,876 points, closely followed by Fee Rock (aka Robert B.) in the second spot with with 37,558 points and Buddy Yorn (aka Clay G.) taking third place, also with a fabulous score of 13,180. Tina Vanilla (aka Jacob C.) took fourth place followed closely by Ava La Rock (Lucy G.) in 5<sup>th</sup>. In the second half of our top 10, we have Bella Springsteen (aka Tilly B.) in 6<sup>th</sup> and Milkshake Flores (aka Georgie H.) in 7<sup>th</sup>. The first top 10 entrant not in Y6 was Nathan Twig (aka Seb R.) from Y4 who made it into 8<sup>th</sup> place, followed by another Y4 representative, Claudio Malone (aka Henry Ch.) in 9<sup>th</sup>. Finishing off the top 10 was Grant Jacobs (aka Jacob G.) from Y5.

The children earn one point for each correct answer so between them these children answered more

than 140,000 questions correctly!



With so many Year 6 players in the top ten, it is probably no surprise that Y6 managed to scoop first place with an average 1146 points per child! Congratulations Year 6. It was a close-run battle for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place. Year 5 battled hard to keep Y4 at bay and were successful in taking second place. Meanwhile Y4 narrowly beat Y3.



Finally, a special mention for those children who were the top 3 scorers for their year group. All of these children made it into the top 20 and each of them answered more than 2100 questions correctly. An awesome performance!
