#### **Do I have permission?**


Next week in our assemblies, we will be exploring the question 'Do I have permission?' which focuses on the concepts of asking, giving and not giving permission; personal boundaries and privacy; respect for others and the right to be respected by others. The statutory Relationships Education objectives we will be covering are:

- The importance of permission-seeking and giving in relationships with friends, peers and adults.
- What sorts of boundaries are appropriate in friendships with peers and others (including in a digital context).

We will be using the PSHE Association guidance and lesson plans called 'Teaching about Consent' which ensures we deliver the information and have discussions at an age- and developmentally-appropriate level. PSHE education in key stage 2 lays the foundations for respectful, consensual and healthy peer relationships as children grow. Children will encounter more specific learning about consent at key stages 3 and 4.
