The Primary Maths Challenge was created by The Mathematical Association and is an international maths competition with children participating from across the world. It is aimed at children aged 9-11 and this is the second year that TRJS have taken part. The first round took place in November and this year almost 58,000 children entered the competition.

The challenge consists of 25 problem-solving questions and children who scored 20 or more in the first round were invited to take part in the Bonus Round in February 2023. 3700 children (approximately 6%) qualified for the bonus round this year and two of these were from Thomas Russell Junior, Evie N and Dylan C in Year 6.


Children who scored 17 or more in the bonus round achieved an award – either bronze silver or gold. This year 2885 children scored 17 or more in the bonus round and I am delighted to say that Dylan scored 18 and achieved a Bronze award and Evie scored 21 and received a Silver Award.
