RAAC

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. The Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC. The DfE has been helping education settings and responsible bodies (such as local authorities and multi-academy trusts) to identify and manage the potential risks of RAAC since 2018. You can find more in the Education Hub article published by DfE.

Please be assured that Thomas Russell Junior has not been asked by the DFE to close any areas of the school. We have carried out initial checks and we judge the building to be SAFE at this point, so we are open as usual. We will continue to liaise with the DFE and Staffordshire County Council to arrange further assessments, in the coming weeks, to ensure that the school buildings remain safe in the future and will endeavour to keep parents informed.

Extra-Curricular Clubs Autumn 2023

Please find the list of clubs for the first half of the Autumn Term below. These activities help children discover a new hobby, improve self-confidence and develop social skills as they mix with a different group of children. I recognise and appreciate the huge commitment of school staff, who are willing to offer clubs on a voluntary basis. Please note that when a child signs up for a club that includes a charge, we expect them to attend the full session every week and would need a written note from parents in advance, if a child was to be absent.

Extra-Curricular clubs are very popular at TRJS and places are given on a first-come-first-served basis. Initially, we place a limit of TWO clubs per child, to give a greater number of children opportunity to attend. Once a club is booked, we expect payment of the amount indicated which will be on ParentPay from 15 September. From Monday 11 September, any places left will then be opened again.

Please note that, to book a place at football with Soccerstars on a Tuesday, parents need to follow the information on p6 and book directly with Soccerstars.

Swimming

As all year groups start swimming next week, we would be very grateful for parents to act as "EYES" to help supervise the lessons. The pool is a wonderful facility and we rely on parental support to ensure we are able to offer this life-saving skill to all the children at school. Please phone or email to let the school office know if you could offer 1 hour from Monday-Thursday afternoons. Thank you. Swimming Kit – girls are required to wear a one-piece swimsuit and boys are to wear 'short' shorts or jammers, not baggy shorts, as they impede the swimmer. All children need a towel, swimming hat and a waterproof bag.

PE Kit

Indoor PE kit – house colour T-shirt, black shorts and pumps (However, we find that a pair of clean indoor trainers are often better than pumps and give the feet more support.) Indoor PE kit is to be left in school. Outdoor PE Kit – house colour T-shirt, plain dark tracksuit trousers and trainers. Please note (especially for Y4 and Y6 who are doing rugby during PE) trainers may well get muddy – it is all part of the fun – so please do not send children into school with expensive fashion trainers.

Jewellery – all items of jewellery must be removed for every PE lesson, including watches. Any children with earrings must remove them or not wear them to school on PE days. The school cannot accept responsibility for any items of jewellery brought into school.
