

This week Year 4 have been to Packington Farm to learn more about habitats and life cycles. During the morning, each class learned about the nests that different birds make before creating their own giant nest to fit their team into out of sticks and branches. This was followed by a woodland walk to collect natural materials for the afternoon's session along with a woodland quiz, identifying the different adaptations that animals have made to live in a woodland habitat. After lunch, Year 4 went pond dipping and were able to observe a wide variety of invertebrates including baby dragonfly, water boatmen, pond skaters and water snails – there were even a few baby newts. Our final activity was outdoor art, with each group using their foraged materials from the morning to create a woodland picture of a habitat or food chain. Year 4 had a wonderful day.
