## **End of Day Routine**

After reflecting on our end of day routines, talking to staff and a number of parents, we are looking at some changes to ensure that we have procedures in place to keep all children safe. From Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November we will insist that ALL pupils in Year 3 and 4 are collected from school. From this date, children in Year 5 and 6 will only be allowed to walk home alone (without an adult) if they have signed permission. A letter will go out to all parents after half term to clarify the end of day routine. The vast majority of parents follow this routine already. It may be that we feel we are in a village that is safe, however, we still need to be vigilant and have clear procedures in place. Thank you in anticipation for your support.

#### **After-School Clubs**

For the rest of the Autumn Term and throughout the Spring Term, we ask that any child attending an after-school club is collected by a parent/carer and are not allowed to walk home on their own. As the nights draw in, it is often dark at 4.30 during the winter and we appreciate the co-operation of parents to help us keep all children safe.

### Choir

Next half term, choir will continue on a Friday after school (3.30-4.30) on the following dates: 10 November, 17 November, 24 November, 1 December and 8 December. This club is for the children who are already signed up. We are doing really well at learning all the songs for Young Voices (on Thursday 25 January), with the Matilda Medley being a firm favourite. We are not revolting children (honestly!).

and great enthusiasm.











## Y4 Teeth

- Y3 Monday 4<sup>th</sup> December




