## **End of Day Routine**

We are planning some changes to the end of day routines to ensure that we have procedures in place to keep all children safe. Therefore, from **Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November** we will insist that ALL pupils in Year 3 and 4 are collected from school by a parent/adult or older sibling. From this date, children in Year 5 and 6 will only be allowed to walk home alone (without an adult) if they have signed permission. We ask for this by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November. For the rest of the Autumn Term and through the Spring Term, we ask that any children attending an after-school club are collected by a parent/carer/older sibling and are not allowed to walk home on their own. 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## Thomas Russell Junior School The place to be YOUR BEST End of the Day Routine: Keeping our Children Safe

Keeping all our children safe at the end of the school day is paramount. After reflecting on our end of day routines, we propose some changes to ensure the safety of all children. The following procedures will be in place **from Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November:** 

- All children in Year 3 and 4 **MUST** be collected by a parent or adult at 3.30pm each day.
- If a Year 5 or 6 child is allowed to walk home without an adult, we ask that parents/carers complete and return a signed permission for their child to do so. Please find the letter attached.
- Year 3 children will be collected from near the two Year 3 classroom doors.
- Each class in Y4,5,6 will be escorted onto the playground at 3.30pm each day by their class teacher, or the member of staff supervising them at the end of the day.
- Staff will then allow the children to go to the adult collecting them.
- We ask all parents to be as prompt at 3.30pm, to ensure the safety of all children.
- All parents/adults collecting are expected to be **ON THE PLAYGROUND** at 3.30pm. We will only release children if the parent/adult can be seen on the playground. There are some parents who currently wait outside the school gates, on Gilmour Lane. We ask all those parents to be on the playground at 3.30pm so we can pass the children to you on the school premises.
- Although it is usually a parent/adult who collects a child at the end of school, some parents feel that an older sibling is appropriate, if that is the case, we insist that the older sibling is of senior school age.
- All parents are expected to wait in the designated space on the playground. This ensures there is a gap between parents and children, so staff are in a position to keep children safe.
- Parents are asked to keep younger siblings with them at all times and not allow them to climb on outdoor tables, walls or play equipment.
- Parents are reminded that the school is a no-smoking area, mobile phones need to be out of sight and dogs are not allowed on school premises.
- Trips please note that parents/adults are always required to collect children if a school trip is due to return to school after 3.30pm.
- Clubs for the rest of the Autumn Term and through the Spring Term, we insist that all children from all year groups are collected at the end of an after-school club by a parent/adult; children will not be allowed to walk home on their own from an after-school club during this time.
- Safeguarding parents are reminded that we do not allow adults into the school building via the playground. If you wish to see a teacher, then please go to the school office to request a meeting.
