

<u>Where My Wellies Take Me...</u> This year we are basing our World Book Day activities around the text, 'Where My Wellies Take Me ...' by Clare and Michael Morpurgo.

Book Blurb:

Pippa loves staying with her Aunty Peggy. She loves going for walks, whether it's sunshiny or cold - long, wandering walks where her wellies take her. Follow Pippa into the beautiful countryside as her day unfolds, and the wildlife, animals and people she encounters are complemented by relevant poems from some of our greatest authors, personally chosen by Clare and Michael Morpurgo. Part poetry anthology, part child's scrapbook, this is a truly lavish project designed to instil a love of language in young children.

This year World Book Day falls on Thursday 3rd March. Children will be embarking on a range of activities linked to the text throughout the week, then celebrate WBD on the Thursday by coming to school in their wellies!

There is great potential for art work and creative poetry, but also links to Geography on the local area, so we are really excited about this project that Mrs Vardy has put together. <u>Celebration of work</u> On Thursday afternoon each class will buddy up with another class in a different year group to share examples of the work we have been doing, whilst wearing our wellies of course!

On Friday 4th March, children then have the option to dress as a book character for the day. Please note this is not a non-uniform day – those not wishing to dress as a book character should just wear normal uniform.



Flexibility, an ability to use initiative and a shared commitment to supporting our children to achieve their full potential are essential. Training will be available for the successful applicant.

Primarily we are looking for TAs to work during morning lesson time, but there may be a necessity either now or in the future for TAs to support in the provision of cover (either 1-2-1, medical or general) during breaks and lunchtimes.
