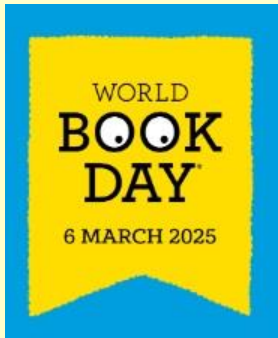

Indoor Athletics at JTHS

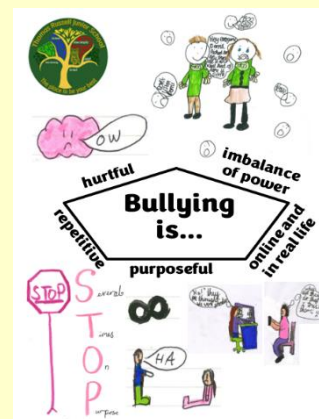
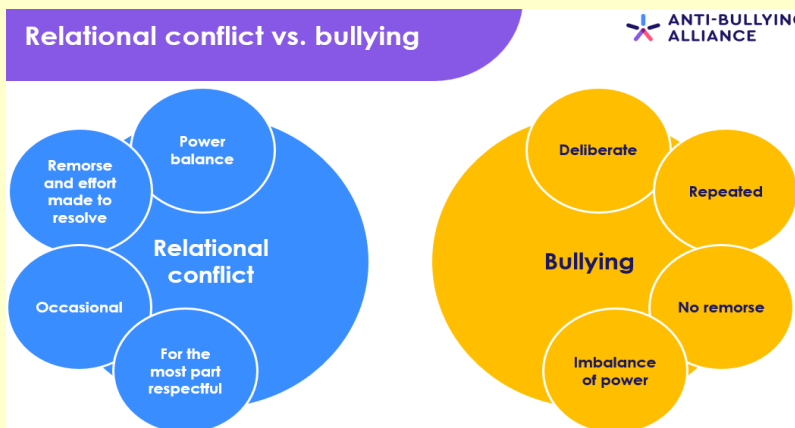

Getting on and Falling Out

Next week in our assemblies we will be learning about healthy friendships, how people choose and make friends, and how we can resolve problems when we fall out with our friends. We will be recapping on the definition of bullying and how this is different from a falling out between friends:



Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

Our Anti-Bullying ambassadors have created an Anti-Bullying Box where children can leave a confidential note for Miss Branson and Mr Emery if they don't want to report bullying to an adult face-to-face. For relational conflict (falling out between friends), we encourage children to try to resolve it themselves with the tools they have learnt, and if needed ask an adult in the moment for help. We have also been awarded a 'Buddy Bench' from Hello Yellow for our playground, that children can use if they would like a friend to play with.
