







Weekly checklist		✓		
<p>Reading - read for 20 minutes a day, five times per week (at least 2 of those to be your reading scheme book) and record it in your reading diary. An adult should sign each entry. Practise reading aloud as well as reading independently (silently). Reading Records will be collected in on Wednesday 28th January.</p> <p>Reading books and reading record books should be in school EVERY day.</p>				
	<p>Reading Plus - complete your x5 reading assignments (including at least x3 completed at school) **These can count as part of your 5 reads above. Record them in your reading record. We are aiming to achieve a reading speed of 185 words per minute and an 80% comprehension average - check your dashboard to see your data!</p>			
	<p>Spellings - log-on to Spelling Shed (usernames and passwords in reading records) to practise our new list of ten words, which all have the +IBLY suffix. These will be tested on Friday 30th January</p>

<p>Please note: some children may have individualised (different) spellings they are working on instead. Your spelling pattern is: words ending in 'y' which add +ER/+EST.</p>				
	<p>Times Tables Practise for at least 30 minutes over the week on TT Rock Stars. Children know which times tables they will be tested on but remember to revise ALL tables facts up to 12x12 regularly to maintain their speedy recall.</p>			
	<p>CGP Books: We will be setting tasks from the CGP books on a fortnightly rotation. Week A will be MATHS and week B will be SPAG. Children will need to have the relevant CGP book in school on a FRIDAY to be marked.</p> <p>Maths CGP: This week, recap on Simplifying Fractions (p18) and Ordering Fractions (p19). When ordering fractions, make sure you convert them all to the same denominator (using the lowest common multiple) and then use the original fraction in your answer (not the conversion).</p>			

Next week:

English - we will be continuing to read 'The Last Bear', identifying examples of descriptive language, writing setting descriptions using figurative language and using the 'show not tell' technique to compose character dialogue.



Maths - we will be continuing with our learning about angles, with a focus on angles in a triangle/quadrilaterals.
