## Night Owls and Early Birds

Due to rising costs, the fees for Night Owls and Early Birds will be increased in September. Early Birds will be £6 per session; Night Owls will be £12 per session (£6 on a Friday). The changes were agreed by the Governing Body of the school; we believe this still offers parents a quality service and good value for money. The price increase will come into effect from 2 September 2026.

When parents book Night Owls for Year 5 or 6 children, we expect children to report to Night Owls straight after school. We have experienced some issues regarding children who have general permission to walk home without a parent. There have been several times this term when a parent has told the child to walk home, but the parent has also booked the child in to Night Owls. This creates concerns regarding the safeguarding and wellbeing of the child and school have needed to ring parents to confirm that the child is safe. Thank you for keeping us informed so we can be sure that everyone is safe.

Night Owls and Early Birds bookings for the Autumn Term (September-December) will open at 6pm on MCAS on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> July.
