After School Care

In April, parents were consulted regarding the possibility of the school offering an 'After School Care' facility to sit alongside our other after school clubs. Parental response was very positive and governors decided the service would commence this term. Any funds that are received over and above the costs of providing the service will be used to provide additional equipment in the school, such as iPads and new whiteboards, to the benefit of all our children.

The school is aware that in July a number of parents received a letter from the after school provider - Badgers. That letter contains a number of factual inaccuracies which, having taken advice, the school wishes to correct.

Badgers believe they have provided a service on behalf of the school but that is not the case. The school has been upfront with them since we contacted them to inform them before the parental consultation. As an independent company, without any formal relationship with the school, Badgers are free to make their own decisions irrespective of any other provisions that are provided by us or any other organisation. It appears that Badgers believe that they can no longer run their service in the new term alongside our own but this is a commercial decision for them. We do wish them the best in their other ventures. If Badgers choose to continue their service, parents are free to use this or any other local provider, in the same way that parents always have been.
